Canandaigua Downtown Revitalization Initiative **Background**

What is the Downtown Revitalization Initiative?

Governor Hochul's Downtown Revitalization Initiative (DRI) is transforming downtown neighborhoods into vibrant communities where the next generation of New Yorkers will want to live, work, raise families, and visit. Participating communities are nominated by the State's 10 Regional Economic Development Councils based on their potential for transformation. One community per region is awarded \$10 million to develop a Strategic Investment Plan and implement catalytic projects that advance the community's vision for revitalization. In February 2025, Canandaigua was announced as the Finger Lakes region winner!

The Consultant Team

The State has hired a consultant team to help facilitate the DRI planning process. Led by Urban Strategies, the team brings expertise in planning, urban design, market research and economic development, architecture, landscape architecture, historic preservation, civil engineering, environmental planning, and cost consulting.

Canandaigua Downtown Revitalization Initiative Submit a Project!

We are looking for projects to support Canandaigua's ongoing revitalization!

The Open Call for Projects will officially be launched May 22 and will remain open until July 11 at 5:00 PM!

Projects should have an immediate, positive, and transformative impact on downtown Canandaigua, which could include new development/additions, rehabilitation, public improvement projects, small building funds, or onetime branding and marketing projects.

Project Requirements

To qualify for DRI funding, projects:

- Must be located within the Canandaigua DRI Boundary. (Exceptions for applications can potentially be made for projects just beyond the boundary).
- Must be able to break ground within two years.
- Should have financing commitments or a clear path of financing.



- Must be large enough to be transformative (min. \$75K). See note below about smaller projects!
- Must have an identified project sponsor with site control.
- Must meet the minimum match requirement of 30% of the total project cost. Sponsors are encouraged to meet the match goal of 40%, which will factor into a project's overall evaluation.
- Must comply with decarbonization standards, if applicable.

The Canandaigua DRI Boundary represents the city's compact, walkable and historic core, extending down towards the lake.

Canandaigua Downtown Revitalization Initiative The Planning Process

The Downtown Revitalization Initiative involves four phases of work. Consultation with the Local Planning Committee and the public is currently helping the study team to refine the vision and develop goals and strategies for Downtown, which will provide the basis for evaluating potential projects for DRI funding. The public will have an opportunity to comment on potential projects at Public Workshop #2, which will be held in the Fall.

Canandaigua Downtown Revitalization Initiative A Vision for Downtown Canandaigua

The following draft vision was crafted as part of the City of Canandaigua's DRI application. This will be refined with input from the LPC, from this Public Workshop, and from the online survey. The vision is intended to concisely describe how the community would like to see downtown in the next 5-7 years. Building on Canandaigua's strengths, the vision is considered to be aspirational yet attainable. Projects that are funded through DRI will help to advance this vision.

Downtown Canandaigua and the Canandaigua Lake waterfront will connect seamlessly via safe, quality walking and biking pathways that complement the existing streets. Downtown will be brimming with a diverse mix of businesses, housing, events, and arts that create a vibrant atmosphere for residents and visitors of all backgrounds. South Main Street will become a highdensity, mixed-use neighborhood that links Downtown to the lakefront with an inviting pedestrian environment.
